

CCA GENERAL MEETING
11/16/10

The meeting commenced at 7:01 pm.

All officers were present.

The minutes from the October meeting were distributed to those in attendance. Rick Bradt made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Cathy Kolbenschlag seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

The Treasurer reported that the balance in the account is \$21,565.19. Property taxes in the amount of approximately \$1,000.00 will be paid this week. The liability insurance is paid.

Linda Hjelle, Chairperson for the Election Committee, reported that the positions open for election are for President, Secretary, and Treasurer. There are four persons on the Election Committee. Elections will take place in January.

The Board of Directors is obtaining quotes for a light/fan for the center of the ceiling of the clubhouse.

There was a discussion of police radar on the La Cresta Road grade.

Paula Dickenson, Crime Prevention Specialist at the Alpine Sheriff's Station, was in attendance. She introduced Lt. Robert Haley and Deputy Leonard Rodriguez, Patrol Officer in Crest. They expressed the importance of calling the department in the event of suspicious activity. Ask for a phone call back after investigation to discuss feedback.

The sheriffs passed out many brochures on a variety of crime prevention topics. Paula is available for a free evaluation of property security issues. Lt. Haley focuses on the root problems in criminology. He stressed the importance of securing property to circumvent

thefts.
