

CCA GENERAL MEETING  
April 20, 2010

All officers were present.

The meeting commenced at 7:08 pm.

Typed minutes from the March meeting were handed out to those in attendance. Tony Atkins made a motion that the minutes be accepted as presented. Kandhy Franklin-Collins seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The Treasurer reported that we have \$27,058.28 in our account.

Boy Scout Austin Darley explained his plans for trail adjustment at Crestridge Ecological Reserve. This is his Eagle Scout project, in participation with the San Diego Mountain Biking Association.

OPEN FORUM:

Kandhy Franklin reported problems with residents walking dogs at South Lane Park. Goat herding dogs are alerted and become protective of their charges.

Jackie Grace and Linda Chase purchased two flats of plants for a planter box at the clubhouse. They have asked for reimbursement. The request was submitted for consideration.

According to Kandhy Franklin, there is now a California for Emergency Response Team (CERT) in Crest.

Diane Brehm feels that after a recent arson fire we should be able to secure 200 letters to the sentencing judge because Crest doesn't need any more fires, given what the residents have already experienced.

There was another discussion regarding traffic problems on Crest Drive. A Traffic Committee has been formed to research ideas.

Kandhy Franklin updated us on the Odum project.

OLD BUSINESS:

A five-year fire certificate has been received on the clubhouse.

The new blinds have been installed in the clubhouse and are working well.

The Garden Club members are adopting flower beds to tend at the clubhouse.

NEW BUSINESS:

A Bingo set was donated by Barbara and Don Halte. Kathy Sawaya donated \$50 for same. Extra cards and markers were ordered with Kathy's contribution.

As the 4<sup>th</sup> of July is on a Sunday, the parade time will be altered slightly to better coincide with church

services. Permits will be obtained for food booths in the park. The silent auction will be held in the clubhouse this year.

Tony Atkins is soliciting bids for refinishing the clubhouse floor.

There was a discussion regarding children and teens on motorcycles in the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade, which is always a safety concern. Paul Johnson will talk with the Crest motorcycle club to attempt to receive ideas about how we may rectify the problem.

Kinesiologist Rosemarie Michelsen may be interested in conducting a lecture for the community.

Glen Weischedel attended the meeting for the purpose of discussing the need to refinish the wooden sign which he made for the clubhouse. He presented several options, and everyone agreed that it would be best to allow the wood grain to show. He will be paid for his work.

Tony Atkins will correct problems with the front doors at the clubhouse. They do not close properly.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 pm.
